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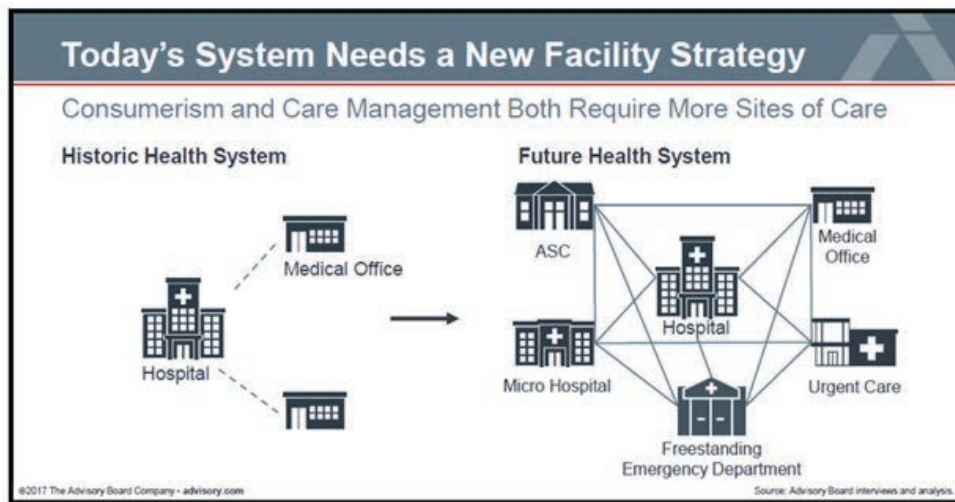

Types of Medical Leases

1. Medical Office Buildings ("MOB")
 - Owned by MOB Developers
 - Leased to Physicians and Physician Practices
2. Retail Space or General Office Building
 - Owned by Retail or Office Developers
 - Leased to Health Care Providers for Medical Use
3. Retail Leases within a Hospital or MOB
 - Owned by Health Care Provider or MOB Developer
 - Leased to Retail Users (café, pharmacy, gift shop)



REGULATORY MATTERS

Regulatory Matters Stark Law

- 42 USCS § 1395nn; 42 C.F.R. § 411.35-411.389
- Applies to landlords which have an ownership structure consisting of physicians or medical providers
- Prohibits referrals for “designated health services” to entities where the physician has a financial relationship
- Regulates referral payments
