- Split

- Operate as a public charity




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 What Private Foundation Re-organizations have you seen?

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Splitting the Foundation

- Structuring the split: One new foundation or two?
- How will assets be divided?
 - Liquidate and transfer/transfer based on value
- Transfer of tax attributes to transferee foundation(s)
 - Distribution requirements
 - Substantial contributors
 - · Expenditure responsibility requirements
 - Other attributes
- Reporting
- · Notifying grantees and other stakeholders



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
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Merging the Foundation
