**CSA FRAMEWORK**

The Controlled Substances Act established a “closed system” that tracks and accounts for controlled substances that are acquired and distributed from the import or manufacture level through distribution to the ultimate end-user

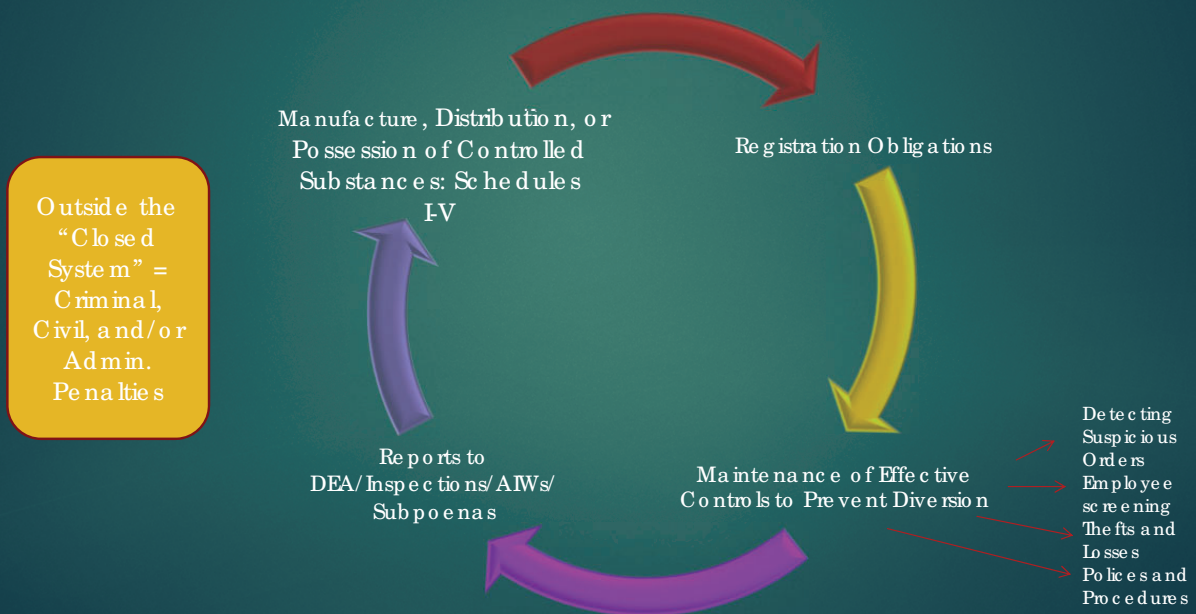
## Schedules of Controlled Substances Under the CSA

- Schedule I-- no currently accepted medical use  
-- e.g., heroin, LSD, marijuana
- Schedule II-- accepted medical use, but high potential for abuse and abuse may lead to severe psychological or physical dependence  
-- e.g., oxycodone, hydrocodone, fentanyl, methadone
