HURRICANE HARVEY

49 counties received a Presidential Disaster Declaration to receive CDBG-DR funding

34 Trillion Gallons of rainwater dumped over Texas and Louisiana

30 percent of Texas' population were directly effected by Hurricane Harvey

\$125 billion in damages to homes, businesses, and infrastructure

PREPS Program - Sheltering

Partial Repair and Essential Power for Sheltering

- Provides the necessary repairs to make Harvey-impacted homes habitable.
 - Restores power
 - Restores running water
 - Functional kitchen
 - Private bathroom
 - Smoke detectors
 - Removes debris
 - Pest control
