Sims v. State, 2019 WL 208631 (p. 1)

- Victim found dead on porch
 - Car, purse, and guns missing
 - Cards used in Wal-Mart
- Sims is possible suspect
 - Identified in Wal-Mart video
- “Emergency Situation Disclosure”
 - Verizon pings the phone
 - Police arrest Sims and girlfriend
- Trial court denies suppression
