

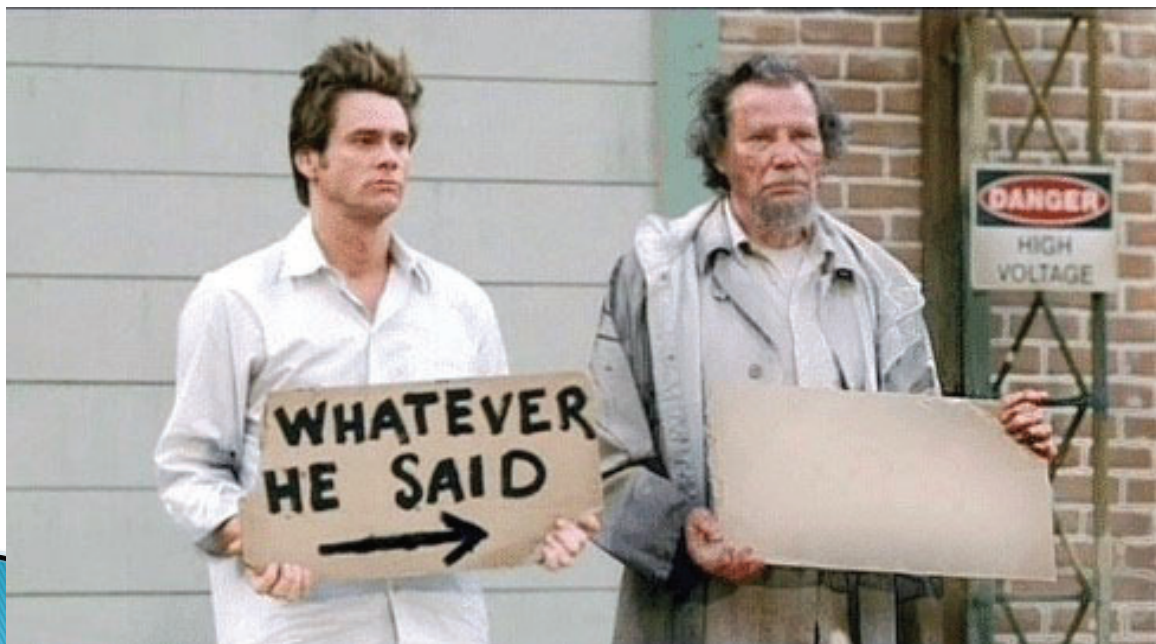

Chevron Deference

Federal doctrine establishing when the courts should defer to a government agency's interpretation, adopted through formal rulemaking or adjudicatory hearing, of a statute it is charged with enforcing

Skidmore Deference

Federal doctrine establishing when the courts should defer to a government agency's interpretation, adopted other than through formal rulemaking or adjudicatory hearing, of a statute it is charged with enforcing (e.g., policy statements, opinion letters, guidelines)
