

What type of deference are we talking about?



Chevron Deference

Federal doctrine establishing when the courts should defer to a government agency's interpretation, adopted through formal rulemaking or adjudicatory hearing, of a statute it is charged with enforcing

2

Skidmore Deference

Federal doctrine establishing when the courts should defer to a government agency's interpretation, adopted <u>other than</u> through formal rulemaking or adjudicatory hearing, of a statute it is charged with enforcing (e.g., policy statements, opinion letters, guidelines)
