

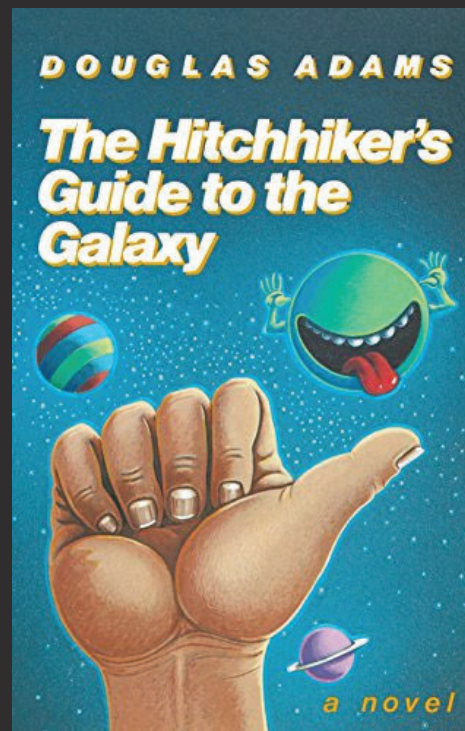

- Is there a plausible allegation?
- Should it be dismissed as an “Inquiry”
- What about the record if it is dismissed?
