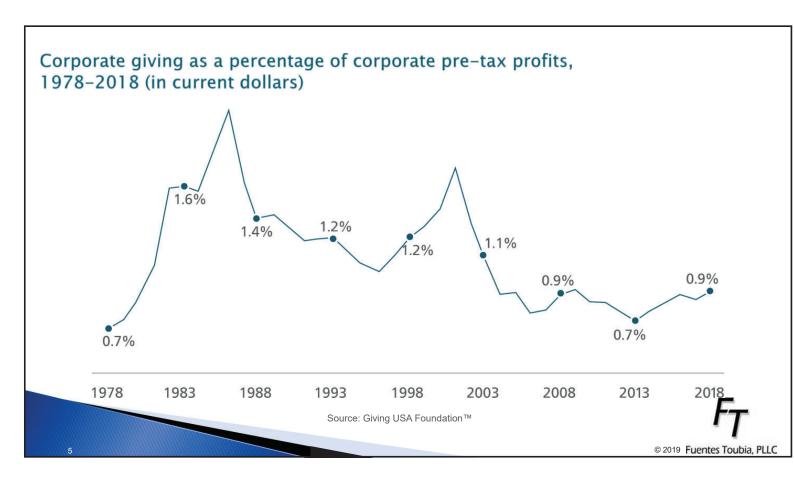

- ► There are over 2,500 corporate foundations (CFs) in US (Source: Foundation Center)
- Charitable giving by CFs increased almost 600% between 2007 and 2018
 - From \$4.4 billion to \$26 billion
- ▶ Education continues to be top priority for CFs receiving 28% of all corporate dollars in 2018
 - Health was second highest with 25%
 - Community and economic development was third highest with 16%
- Nine of ten CFs match employee contributions, but of the \$26 billion* given by CFs in 2018, only 11% (\$2.86 billion) represents employee matches
- Corporations have been giving to charities since Internal Revenue Act of 1935 allowed them to deduct 5% of pretax earnings for gifts to charities

Introduction

- Why have CFs grown so much?
 - Easier way to get tax benefit for corporate resources, e.g. multi-year grants.
 - CFs are separate legal entities that allow for independent decision-making.
 - Better public perception when CF makes gift instead of corporation because CF is viewed as benevolent.
