Federal ABLE Act

The Stephen Beck Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) Act

The federal ABLE Act passed by Congress in December 2014 added Section "529A" to the Internal Revenue Code. The federal Act authorized states to establish ABLE programs.

Created a new savings option for eligible individuals with disabilities:

- to save money in a tax-advantaged account,
- to be used for qualified disability expenses, and
- to be able to retain their eligibility for means-tested public benefits.
