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THC and Cannabis Plants

THC

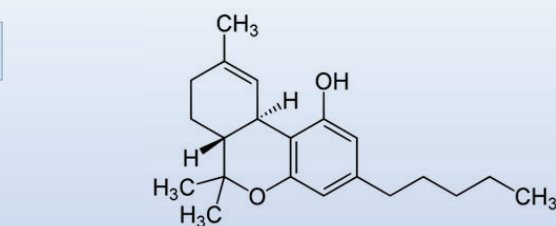
- Characteristics of Stimulant, Sedative, Tranquilizer, Hallucinogen
- Natural product from the Cannabis plant (*Cannabis sativa*)

Other Cannabinoids

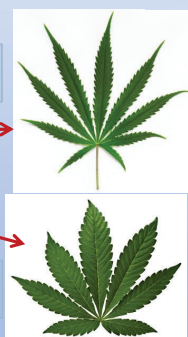
- 61 cannabinoids in *Cannabis sativa*
- *Cannabis indica*
 - more THC than CBD

Preparations

- Plant material: <15% THC
- Sinsemilla: <17% THC
- Resin/Hash: <20% THC
- Hash oil: 20-70% THC
