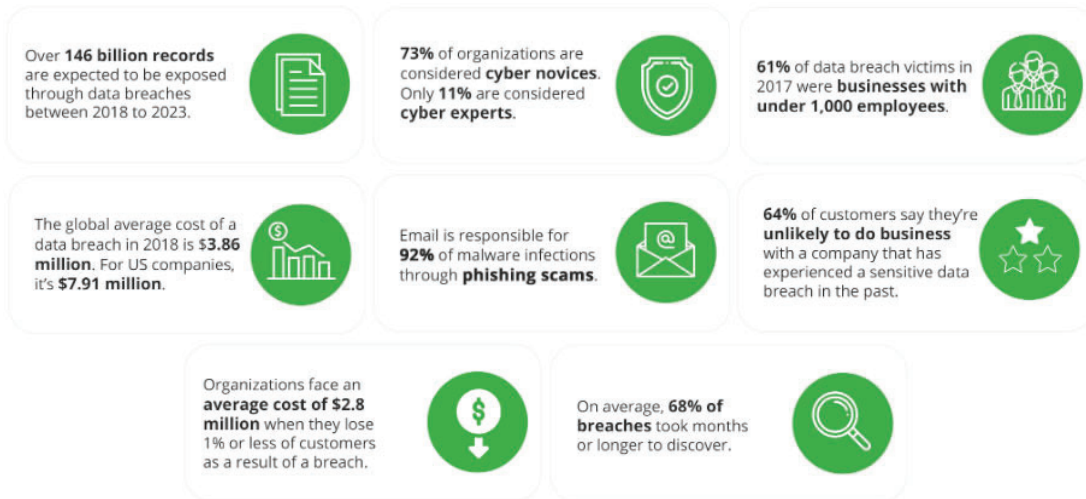

- Training on security and awareness

- Performing behavior analytics and risk assessment
- Communicating regularly with IT



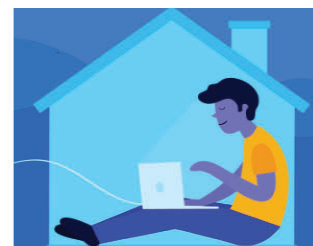

1. Internal Controls for Remote Work

- Education and training updates
- Keep employees engaged
 - Team training
 - Phishing exercises
- Monitor data flow
 - *E.g.*, are people sending secure data to personal accounts?
- No one-size-fits-all solutions
 - Adjust protocols based on duties and needs
 - *E.g.*, management vs. call center employees vs. interns
