The Medicaid Estate Recovery Program (MERP) is required by the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1993 (OBRA '93) to recover the costs paid by Medicaid for long-term care benefits received by certain Medicaid recipients.

As a result of the mandate of 42 U.S. Code § 1396p(b)(1), Texas enacted 1 Tex. Admin. Code § 373.101 et seq., establishing MERP.
