Working-Age Population Growth Will Fall by Half



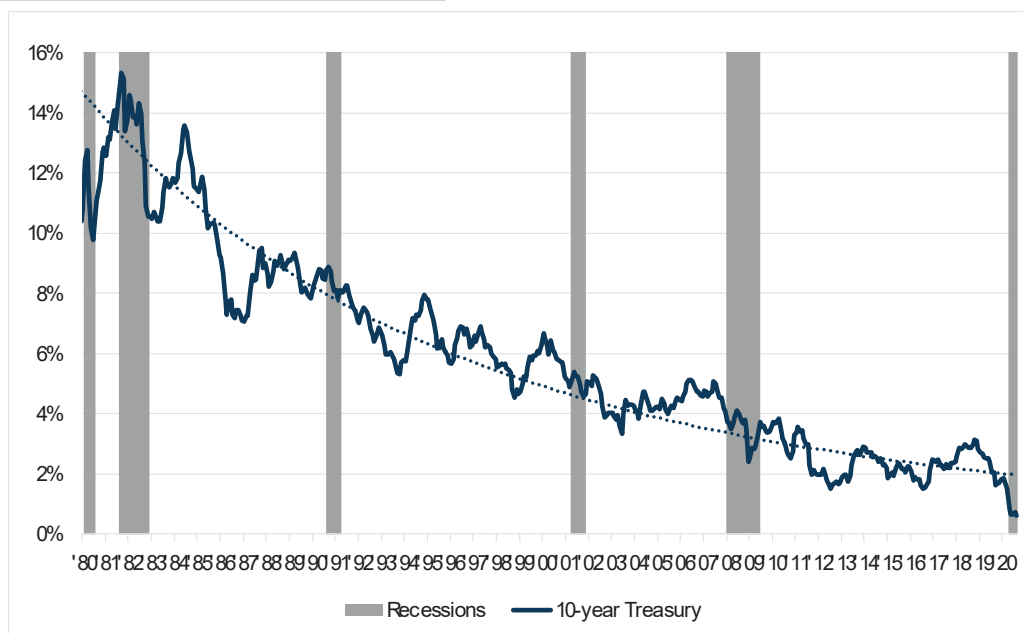
Less Consumption, More Health-Related Expenditures



The Dependency Ratio is Increasing

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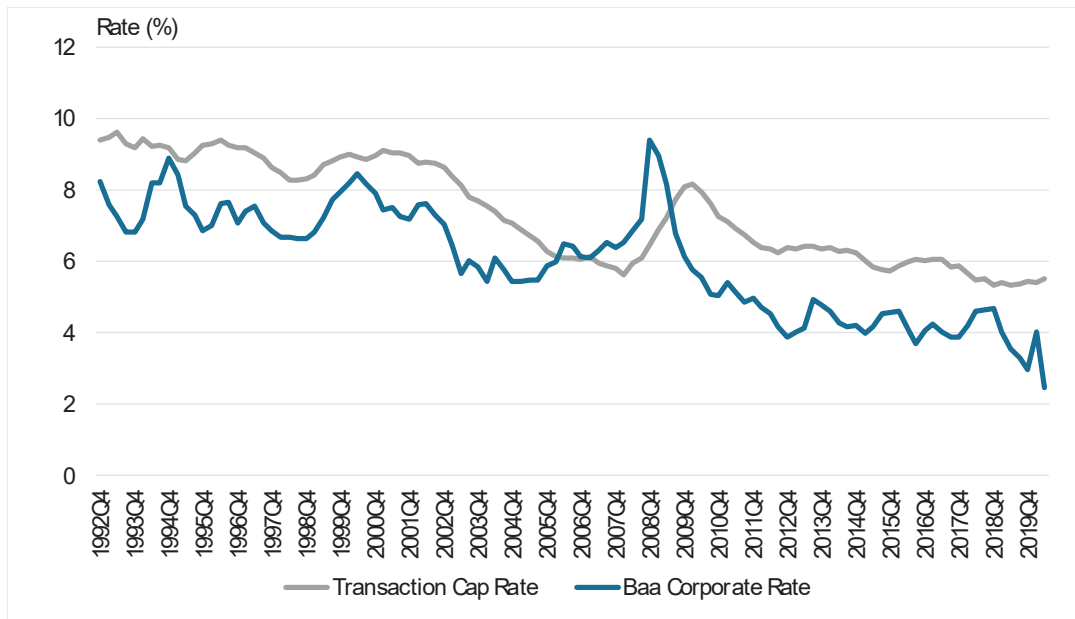
## Secular Decline in Long-Term Government Bond Yields

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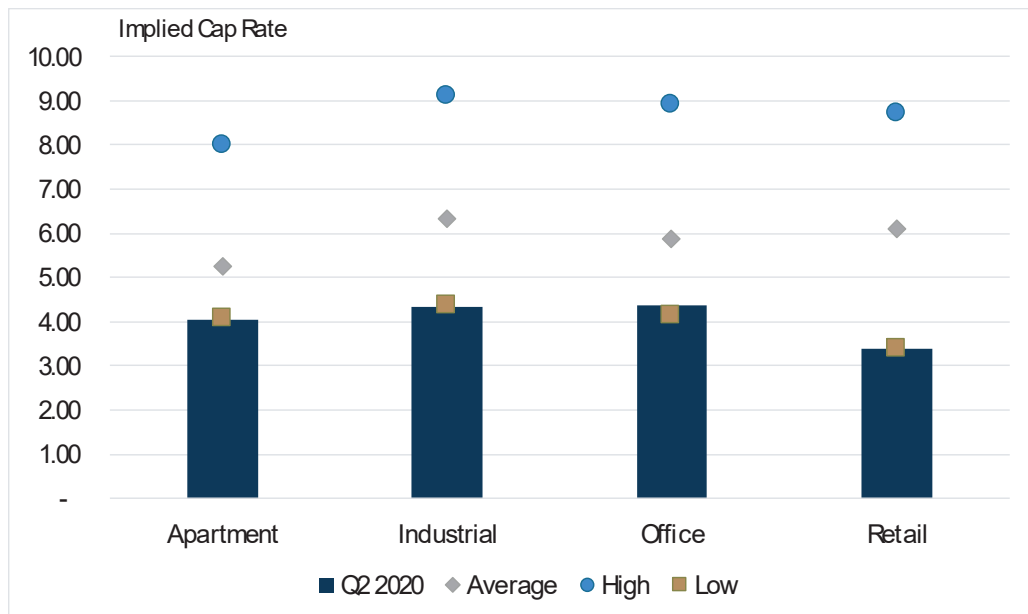
## Property Yields and Corporate Bonds Trended Lower Over Time
