History and Phase One Trade Deal

- **Old Linkage System (if any)**
- **Policy Changes in 2017-2019**
- **Phase One Trade Deal (Article 1.11)**
 - Meaning of “Effective Mechanism for Early Resolution of Patent Disputes”
 - China shall provide: (a) a system to provide notice to a patent holder, licensee, or holder of marketing approval, that such other person is seeking to market that product during the term of an applicable patent claiming the approved product or its approved method of use; (b) adequate time and opportunity for such a patent holder to seek, prior to the marketing of an allegedly infringing product; and (c) procedures for judicial or administrative proceedings and expeditious remedies
 - China shall establish a nationwide system for pharmaceutical products...
 - Implementation: Patent Law, Judicial Interpretations and Implementation Rules
