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Make sure you thoroughly understand any and all orders, regulations that impact your building and your tenants, and on your tenant mix. Note that some of the various regulations conflict on the city, county, state and national levels. You should understand your rights and obligations. You should also identify any specific rights and obligations that may apply to your tenants, depending on their business.

Itemize all tasks and processes that were either delayed, eliminated, or reduced while you and your staff were engaged in shelter-in place. You need to understand what items and processes need to be restarted or revised now that the world is changing rapidly. This includes physical processes, such as maintenance and repair to your buildings, as well as internal processes, such as

Ensure building staff, management, engineering, security janitorial all have proper PPE.

Have a confirmed COVID-19 case preparedness plan and plan. Your plan should take into consideration advice from professional advisors. Note that there is no one-size-fits-a so your plan may vary slightly from building to building. need to make plans for a subsequent breakout of COVID- this year. Hopefully, this will not happen, but you should planning for how to handle a second extended shelter-in scenario.
