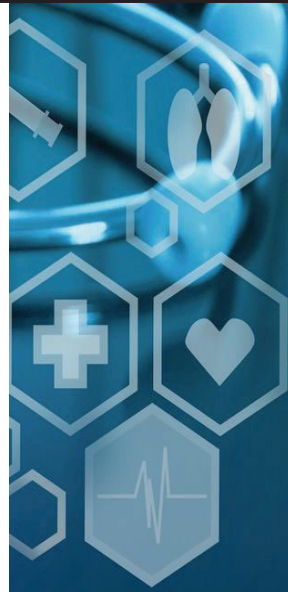

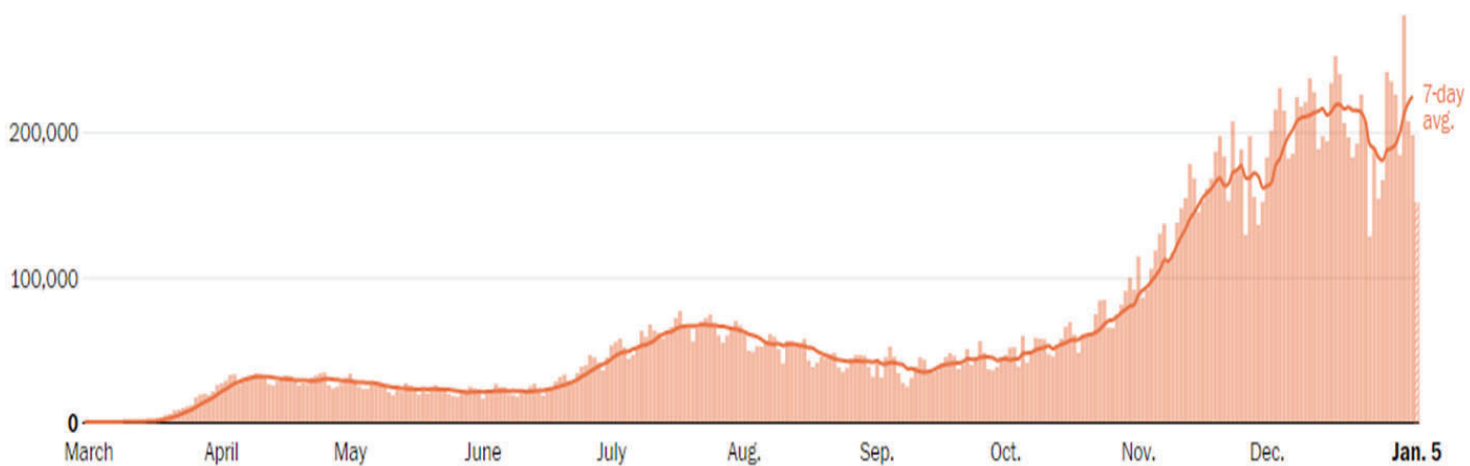

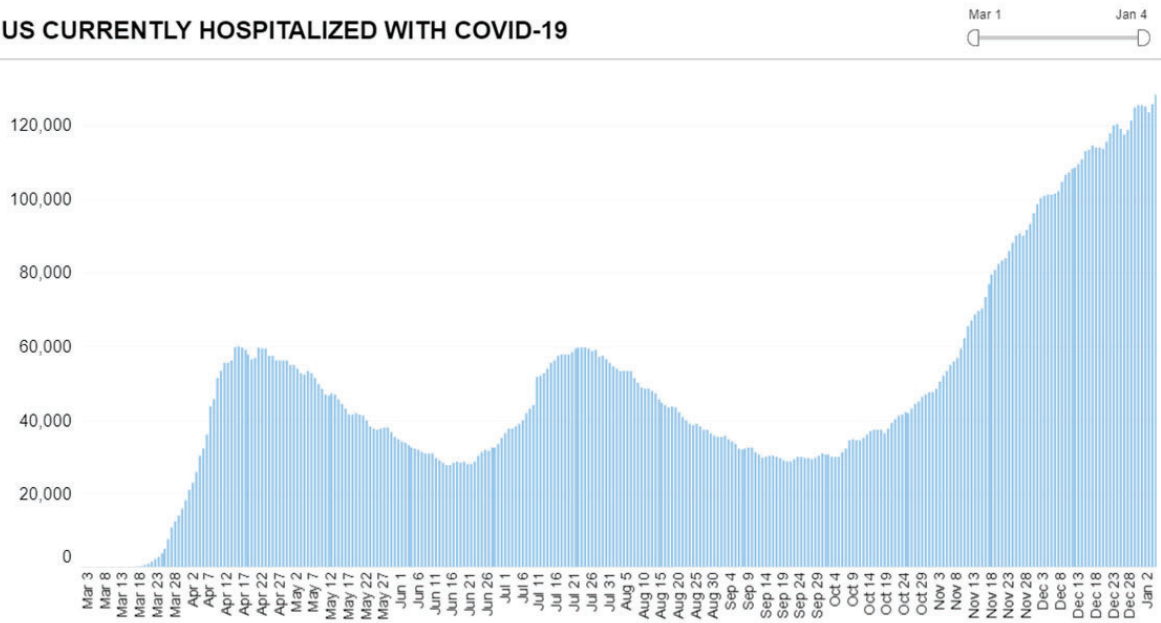

US CURRENTLY HOSPITALIZED WITH COVID-19



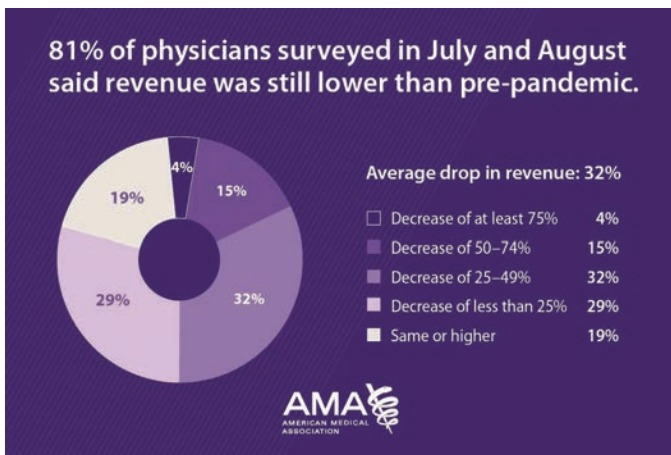

HOSPITALS AND PHYSICIANS HAVE FELT ECONOMIC IMPACT FROM COVID

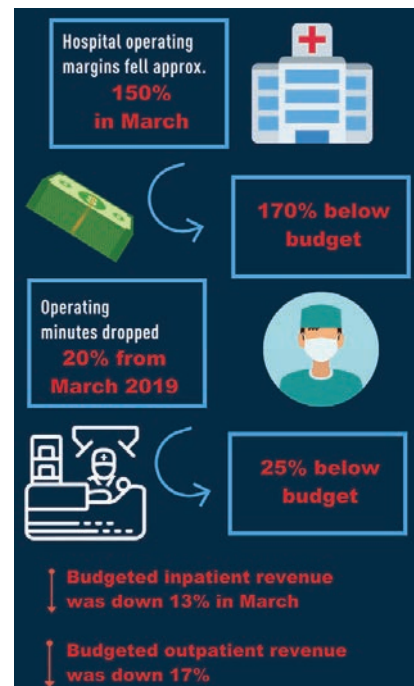
