




## The Rule of Capture pp. 393-98


- If you're pumping oil from a well on your tract, there's no liability for draining oil & gas from under another's tract
  - Avoids legal disputes about where oil came from—if it's produced from your well, it's yours
- This does not authorize trespass, including drilling under another person's property
- But subject to correlative rights doctrine
