

Implications under the Texas Public Information Act







Gov't Code § 552.002(a) - "Public Information"

- information that is written, produced, collected, assembled, or maintained under a law or ordinance or in connection with the transaction of official business:
 - (1) by a governmental body;
 - (2) for a governmental body and the governmental body:
 - (A) owns the information;
 - (B) has a right of access to the information; or
 - (C) spends or contributes public money for the purpose of writing, producing, collecting, assembling, or maintaining the information; or
 - (3) by an individual officer or employee of a governmental body in the officer's or employee's official capacity and the information pertains to official business of the governmental body.

"Governmental body" may include:

- municipal governing boy in the state 552.003(1)(A)(iii)
- deliberative body that has rulemaking or quasi-judicial power and that is classified as a department, agency, or political subdivision of a county or municipality 552.003(1)(A)(iv)
- certain property owner's associations 552.0036
- certain private entities
 - Records held by a private attorney employed by a municipality that relate to legal services performed at the request of the municipality – Open Records Decision No. 499 (1988)
 - Records prepared by a private consultant under contract with a
 governmental body where the consultant keeps the report and data in
 the consultant's office and the governmental body reviews it there –
 Open Records Decision No. 462 (1987)
