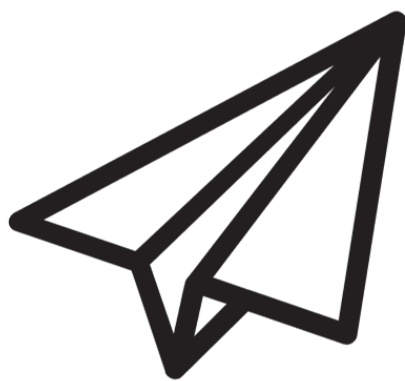



# Bookmarks
