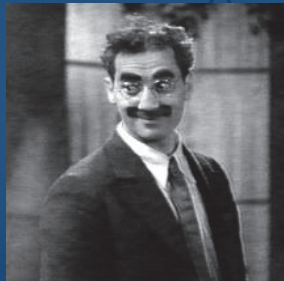

87th Lege - Bill Statistics



Filed: 6,927 bills

Historically speaking: 3rd Highest

- 81st Legislature (2009): 7,419
- 86th Legislature (2019): 7,324

Passed: 1,070 bills

- 86th Legislature (2019): 1,429
- 81st Legislature (2009): 1,459
- 72nd Legislature (1991): 960*

87th Lege Demographics

- 181 seats
 - House – 150 (83 R / 67 D)
 - Senate – 31 (18 R / 13 D)
- 64 licensed attorneys
 - 55 – House
 - 9 – Senate
