- July 2020: Schrems II decision
- Privacy Shield invalidated
- New requirements for data transfers:
 - The “Transfer Impact Assessment”
 - “Supplemental Measures”

Koordinierte Prüfung internationaler Datentransfer

- Coordinated investigation of the German DPAs into private-sector data transfer practices
- Areas of investigation:
 - Email marketing service providers
 - Webpage hosting providers
 - “Web tracking” (i.e. common website trackers)
 - Recruiting management service providers
 - Intracompany transfers of employee and customer data
