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Your Duty to a Tribunal

- 1. Don't make a false statement of material fact or law.
- 2. Don't fail to disclose a fact when disclosure is necessary to avoid assisting a criminal or fraudulent act.

Your Duty to a Tribunal

What Should You Do If You Discover Client Fraud (or Potential Fraud)?

 Persuade Client to allow attorney to correct or withdraw false evidence.

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Your Duty to a Tribunal

What Should You Do If You Discover Client Fraud (or Potential Fraud)?

- If such efforts are unsuccessful, take reasonable remedial steps including disclosure of true facts.
- If it hasn't been offered to the tribunal yet, don't offer it!
