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Public Benefits -

For the Aged, Blind and Disabled

Categorically Eligible for Medicaid

- Typically receiving means-tested income benefits
- Cap on resources and income
- Traditional Medicaid

Medically Needy for Medicaid

- Typically not receiving means-tested income benefits
- Cap on resources, but income can be "spent down" on an ongoing basis
- Usually Medicaid Long Term Care



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Elder Law Planning

Public benefits for the Medically Needy:

Typically Medicaid Long-term Care



Most often not eligible for income benefits



Must spenddown income to qualify for Medicaid



Planning opportunities surround resources
