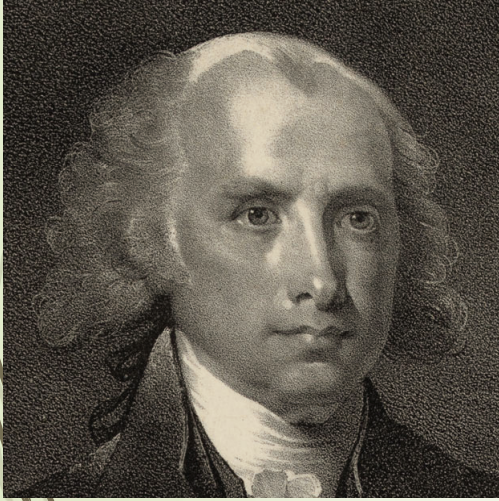

1791 Bill of Rights



1st Amend.

➤ "Congress shall make no law . . . abridging the freedom of speech"

➤ Exceptions:

- True threats
- Obscenity
- Defamation
- Fraud
- Incitement
- Speech integral



1st Amend. and cyberstalking statutes

- “Congress shall make no law . . . abridging the freedom of speech”



- 18 U.S.C. § 2261A(2), the federal cyberstalking statute



18 U.S.C. § 2261A(2)(B) (2013)

E.g., flag burning is expressive conduct:

~ *Texas v. Johnson*

~ *U.S. v. Eichman*

to kill, injure, harass, intimidate, . . . ,
any interactive computer service or . . . ,
to engage in a **course of conduct** that—

- (B) causes, *attempts to cause*, or would reasonably be expected to cause substantial emotional distress to [another person shall be punished].
