CONFIDENTIALITY

- Tex. Disciplinary. R. Prof. Conduct 1.05 (Confidentiality of Information)
- Lawyers must take care to protect confidential client information, which includes both privileged and unprivileged client information

ADVERTISING

- Tex. Disciplinary. R. Prof. Conduct 7.04 (Filing Requirements for Advertisements and Solicitation Communications)
- Lawyers need to submit advertisements to the Advertising Review Committee
- Tex. Disciplinary. R. Prof. Conduct 7.03 (Solicitation and Other Prohibited Communications)
- Lawyers cannot generally use social media or other forms of electronic communication for soliciting new clients

ADVERTISING

- Tex. Disciplinary. R. Prof. Conduct 7.02 (Advertisements)
- Lawyers must not include certain language regarding specialization in advertisements, and must conform to certain requirements regarding pricing advertised
- Tex. Disciplinary. R. Prof. Conduct 7.05 (Communications Exempt from Filing Requirements)
- Lawyers may not have to filing advertisements if they fit into certain exemptions, included social media not expressly offering legal services and intended for educational purposes
