4 Medina Tovar v. Zuchowski



Medina Tovar v. Zuchowski, 982 F.3d 631 (9th Cir. 2020)

- □ Is a spouse who married the U-1 after the I-918 was filed eligible for derivative U nonimmigrant (U-2) status?
 - Compare INA § 101(a)(15)(U)(ii) permits qualifying family members to accompany or follow to join the U principal
 - □ and 8 CFR § 214.14(f)(4) ("the relationship between the U-1 principal alien and the qualifying family member must exist at the time Form I-918 was filed...")
- □ Holding: Statutory language is clear that marriage to U-1 does not need to exist prior to I-918 adjudication, so regulation requiring earlier existence of relationship is invalid

USCIS Implementation

- □ USCIS will apply holding to U visa and T visa cases nationwide
 - U visa policy: USCIS Policy Manual, Vol. 3, Part C, Chp. 2, B
 - Applies to all qualifying family members, not only spouses
 - T visa policy: USCIS Policy Manual, Vol. 3, Part B, Chp. 4
 - Applies to spousal and step-parent/step-child relationships
