

ABA Model Rule 4-101; Tex Rule 1.05(a)



(A) "Confidence" refers to information protected by the attorney-client privilege under applicable law, and

. .

"secret" refers to other information gained in the professional relationship that the client has requested be held inviolate or the disclosure of which would be embarrassing or would be likely to be detrimental to the client.

ABA Model Rule 4-101



- (B) Except when permitted under DR4-101(C), a lawyer shall not knowingly:
 - (1) Reveal a confidence or secret of his client.
 - (2) <u>Use</u> a confidence or secret of his client for the *dis-*advantage of the client.
 - (3) <u>Use</u> a confidence or secret of his client for the advantage of himself or of a third person, unless the client consents after full disclosure.
