Mineral Ownership: The Basics

Mineral Ownership 101

- Two estates:
 - Mineral Estate
 - Surface Estate
- Like the Surface Estate, the Mineral Estate can be owned by multiple people

Mineral Estate is Dominant

- What does it mean to be dominant?
 - Right to use as much of the surface, subsurface, and adjacent airspace as reasonably necessary to enjoy the mineral estate
 - Mineral Estate defeats Surface Estate in the event of any conflict
- Broad, implied rights to use the surface
