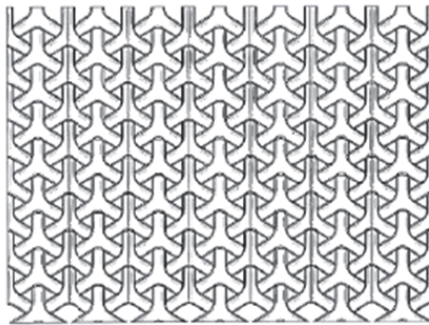

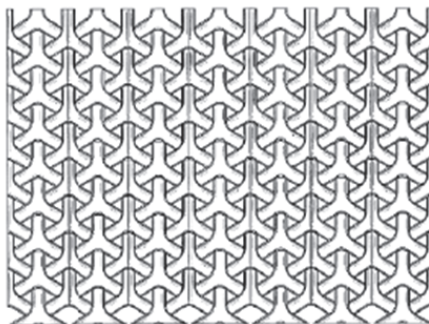

Accused Design: Basket

Fed. Cir. A basket is not a chair. No infringement.
In other words, **THE TITLE/CLAIM MATTERS.**

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
