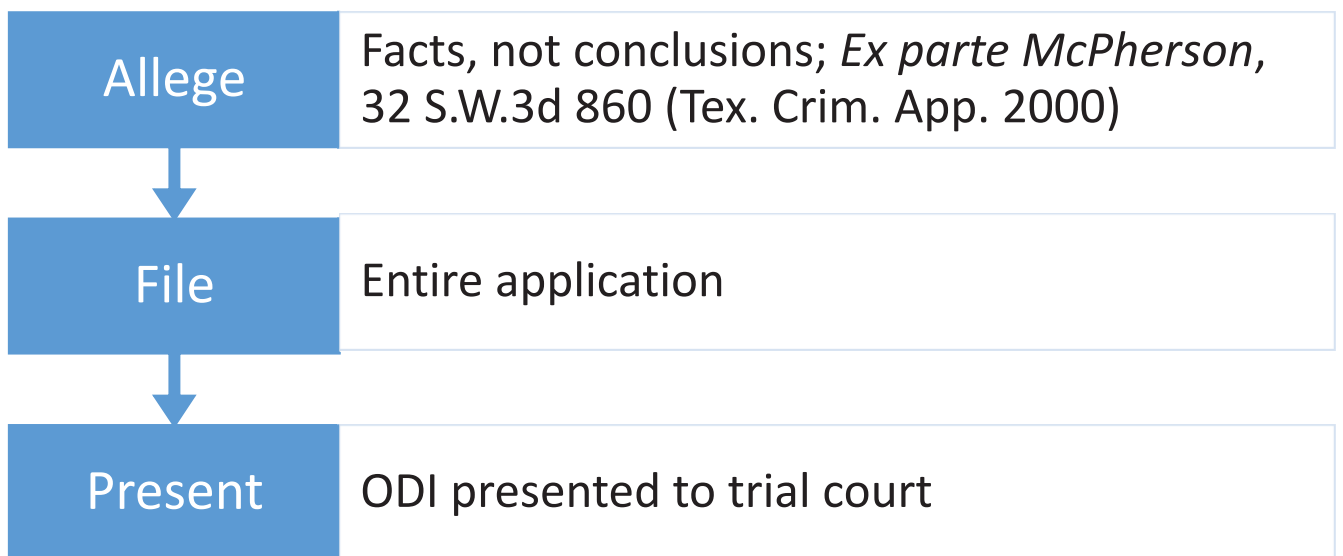

- Confinement: *Ex parte Harrington*, 310 S.W.3d 453 (Tex. Crim. App. 2010)
