When Error is on Life Support

Error Resuscitation

Error that can be asserted for the first time *after trial* in post-verdict motions.



Expert Motions

 Failure to make reliability challenge in *Robinson* motion

Trial

Unobjected-to testimony

Charge Conference

Unobjected-to questions







Experts: Coastal Transport Co. v. Crown Central Petroleum, 136 S.W.3d 227 (Tex. 2004)

Negligence and gross-negligence case

• Explosion in bulk loading facility caused by gasoline spill and engine spark

Expert testimony on conscious indifference for gross negligence

- "In your opinion, did Coastal have an actual subjective awareness of the risk involved in failing to stop using probes that can have [sensor failure] problems?"
- "And in your opinion, did Coastal nevertheless proceed with conscious indifference to the rights, safety or welfare of others?"
- <u>No objection</u>

Procedural history

- Trial court directs a verdict because no evidence of gross negligence
- COA reverses directed verdict because of failure to object to expert's testimony
- SCOTX reverses and renders, affirming trial court's judgment

Experts: Coastal Transport Co. v. Crown Central Petroleum (Tex. 2004)

Conclusory

- "Non-probative on its face"
- No evidence
- No objection necessary

Methodology

- "Looks beyond what expert said"
- Reliability
- Objection necessary
