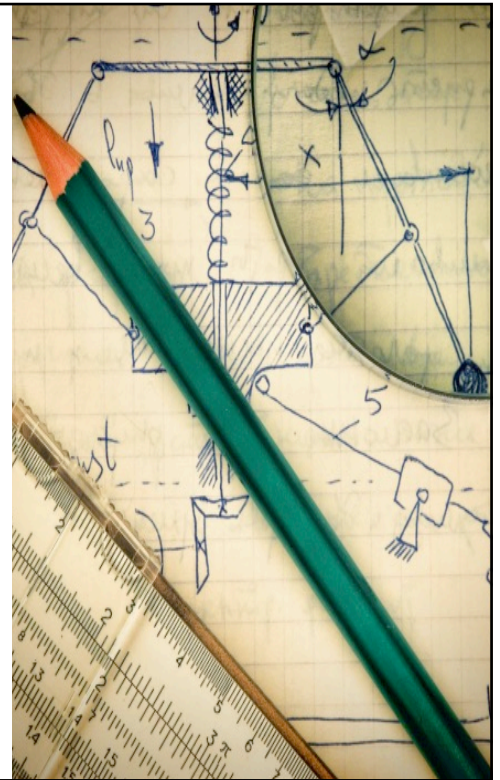

Unified Patent Court System


EP Opt-out UPC System

“Sunrise period”
Jan.-Mar. 2023

Risk for patentees facing multinational invalidation actions on the first day against “crown-jewel patents” 

New system co-exists with national court system during the transitional period of 7 (or 14) years

Introduction

Opt-out decision

- Opt-out decision requires knowing what you opt in or out and what are the pros and cons of the new system
- Opt-out decision only concerns EPs; different decision whether to seek UPs in the future for which the UPC is compulsory
- This presentation does not cover the topic of whether to seek a UP instead of EPs or national patents

Coverage

- One decision for many countries instead of enforcement country by country
- But the UPC does not cover all European countries, only those countries that are:
 - EPC member states
 - EU member states
 - Participate in the enhanced cooperation and
 - Ratified the UPC agreement
