What market changes have we seen?

- > ORDC: Completed Jan 1, 2022,
 - Increase MCL from 2000MW to 3000MW
 - Decrease SWOC / HCAP from \$9000 to \$5000
 - Decouple SWOC and VOLL
 - Produce Bi-Annual <u>report</u> (October 31, 2022)
- > ERS: announced Nov 2021, codified soon after
 - Deploy before EEA
 - Budget increased from \$50M to \$75M
- > FFSS: First round procured Sep 2022
 - Paid \$53M for existing capabilities
- > FFR: implemented Oct 2022
- Load participation in Non-Spin: May 2022


