

History

Oil and gas well permitting is handled by the Railroad Commission of Texas ("RRC")

- 1891 Created by legislative enactment
- 1919 Oil & Gas Division
- 1920 Gas Utilities
- 1976 Surface Mining
- 1984 Alternative Fuels
- (2005 Ceased oversight of railroads)

Enabling statute(s): Texas Natural Resources Code

- §85.041 Prevent waste, protect correlative rights, and prevent pollution
- §85.042 Adopt rules and orders as necessary

- Pipeline Safety

- Mining and Exploration
