Respect for the human rights of athletes, fans, children, workers, the press, and communities around which sporting events take place creates a positive, lasting impact associated with the practice of and participation in sports.

Respect for human rights is a key part of integrity in sport. Sports bodies typically have policies systems, and processes to address integrity issues and should ensure that respect for human rights are integrated within these.



When reconciled with its purpose and activities, an organisation's mission and values create a foundation on which to embed respect for human rights across the range of governance models that exist in the sector.

Sport has the power to transcend issues of social inequality and social injustice and be a platform for protecting human rights, dignity, and equality. Sport can and should serve as a catalyst to create positive benefits and lasting impact for communities, especially those that play host to large sporting events.
