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Planning with Trusts

- Testamentary / Inter vivos Minor's Trusts
- Testamentary / Inter vivos Support Trusts
- Multi-generational Creditor Protection Trusts
- Irrevocable Life Insurance Trusts
- ➤ The type of trust used is determined by the specific goals that we are trying to achieve for our client.

Planning with Trusts: Protection

- From minor or spendthrift beneficiary
- From being counted as an estate asset
- From future creditors
- Special Needs Trusts
- Protection from being considered as a "countable resource" that is "available" to the trust beneficiary by a public benefits agency

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Planning with Trusts: SNTs

- Identify the specific public benefit program
- Understand the characteristics of that program
- Determine if a trust is necessary
- If yes, what type of trust is required to meet the goals with regard to that specific program
- ➤ What *are* the programs?
