Ex parte Lee 673 S.W.3d 755 (Tex. App. Waco 2023)

- ▶ Lawyer filed appeal challenging bail.
- ▶ 3 of the 5 cases cited were published.
- ▶ None actually exist in SW reporters
- ▶ Other 2 cites are Missouri cases

Lee holding

- ▶ “Accordingly, because Lee inadequately briefs his sole issue, it presents nothing for our review and is overruled.”
- ▶ Waco Court spared attorney and did not report to State Bar because the had no information why the briefing was “illogical.”
