#### **State Employees:**Broader/More Restrictive

- 11<sup>th</sup> Amendment Immunity for States
- Congress' 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment authority: must be "congruence and proportionality between injury to be prevented or remedied and means adopted to that end."
- Age Discrimination In Employment Act
- Americans With Disabilities Act
- Family and Medical Leave Act (self care)
- Immunity for <u>State Employers & Arms Of State Only</u> NOT Local or County Employers

## Ways Around Immunity (Kind Of)

- ADEA, ADA or FMLA Actions OK Against <u>Agency</u>
   <u>Head in Official Capacity</u> for <u>Prospective Injunctive</u>
   <u>Relief</u> (Reinstatement), Attorneys Fees and Costs
- Disability Discrimination Claims Under Rehabilitation Act § 504 But (1) Agency Must Receive Federal Funds, and (2) No Emotional Distress Damages
- Can't File TCHRA State Law Claim In Federal Court (Subject To Dismissal) – Must Originate In State Court

#### FREE SPEECH IN THE WORKPLACE

- Public employees have First Amendment rights
- But rights can be limited more than public generally
- Pickering v. Bd. of Educ, 391 U.S. 561 (1968)
- Balancing test: employee rights are measured against governmental employer's needs
- Does "employee's interest in speech outweigh employer's interest in governmental efficiency?"

# **Elements Of Free Speech Claims:**

- 1. Adverse employment action?
- 2. Matter of public concern?
- 3. Did employee's "interest in speech outweigh employer's interest in governmental efficiency?"
- 4. Was speech <u>"substantial or motivating factor"</u> for adverse action?
