Local Rules

- Supreme Court approval is no longer needed for local rules.
- Local rules cannot be inconsistent with other law or with rules adopted by the Supreme Court.
- Local rules must be published on the Office of Court Administration's website.
- Judicial Rule of Administration 10 gives the Court the authority to direct changes to local rules.
