### **Definitions**

**Artificial Intelligence:** The simulation of human intelligence processes by computer systems, enabling them to learn, reason, and problem-solve.

**Heuristics:** The ability and process of problem-solving by creating cognitive shortcuts that deliver "good enough" results that can be useful or effective under time or resource constraints.

# **Examples of Artificial Intelligence**

- ► Reactive AI: Responds to inputs without using internal models or learning from past experiences. E.g., chess programs.
- ▶ Predictive Al: Predicts future outcomes based on historical data, such as predicting stock prices or weather forecasts.
- ► Analytical AI: Analyzes complex data sets and extracts meaningful insights.
