SCOPE OF THE REPRESENTATION

- Its important to remember that an attorney advises the guardian as a fiduciary versus doing tasks that should be done by the client.
- The Texas Estates Code enumerates the duties of a guardian of the person and estate. Tex. Est. Code § 1151.051(c) and Tex. Est. Code § 1151.101.
