Initial Steps

- Transportation code violations:
 - exiting a private drive;
 - · unsafe speed;
 - stop sign; and,
 - traffic signal.
- •Is the investigating officer in a traffic or transportation unit?

- •Spoken language of drivers, witnesses, and officers.
- •Notes on witnesses.
- •Injury severity might matter (consider changes to reporting guidelines).
