What are Artificial Intelligence Tools?

- Artificial intelligence (AI) is intelligence—perceiving, synthesizing, and inferring information—demonstrated by machines, as opposed to intelligence displayed by non-human animals and humans
- Example tasks in which this is done include maps and navigation, facial detection and recognition, text editors and autocorrect, chatbots, digital assistants, and social media

What are Artificial Intelligence Tools? (Everyday World)

AI applications include

- advanced web search engines (e.g., Google Search)
- recommendation systems (used by YouTube, Amazon and Netflix)
- understanding human speech (such as Siri and Alexa)
- text auto-complete on your smartphone
- self-driving cars

What are Artificial Intelligence Tools? (Legal Industry)

- E-discovery tools such as review of documents for discoverable or otherwise relevant information
- AI-powered legal research software
- contract and legal document analysis
- proofreading, error correction and document organization
