

## Statutory Background: SOS Role in Agency Rulemaking and Open Meetings

#### Texas Government Code, Chapter 2002, Subchapter B: Texas Register

- SOS "shall compile, index, cross-index to statute, and publish a publication to be known as the Texas Register."
- Register contains, among other things:

- o Emergency, proposed, withdrawn and adopted rules
- o Notices of state agency rule review
- $\circ$  Governor's executive orders, appointments, and proclamations
- $\,\circ\,$  Summaries of Attorney General requests for opinions and opinions
- Miscellaneous documents (e.g., requests for proposal, error corrections, agency orders)
- Register must be made available to the public via the Internet at no charge.

#### Texas Government Code, Chapter 2002, Subchapter C: Texas Administrative Code

- SOS "shall compile, index, and publish a Texas Administrative Code."
- TAC must contain each rule adopted by a state agency under Chapter 2001 but not emergency rules.
- TAC must be made available to the public via the Internet at no charge, updated daily with new and revised rules – current to today's date.





#### Texas Government Code, Chapter 551 (Open Meetings Act)

Texas Secretary

- General Rule: Notice of a meeting of a governmental body must be posted in a place that is readily accessible to the public for at least 72 hours before the scheduled time of the meeting. (Tex. Gov't Code § 551.043).
- Exception for State Governmental Bodies: SOS must post notice of a meeting of "a state board, commission, department, or officer having statewide jurisdiction" for at least 7 days before the day of the meeting – with certain specified exceptions. (Tex. Gov't Code § 551.044).
- The posting provisions for statewide entities also apply to the governing body of a water district or other district or political subdivision that extends into 4 or more counties. (Tex. Gov't Code § 551.053).
