


Accommodation Doctrine Basics


 Courts require application of the accommodation doctrine when the surface owner proves "there is an <u>existing use by the surface owner</u> which would otherwise be precluded or impaired, and where under the established practices in the industry there are <u>[reasonable]</u> alternatives available to the lessee whereby the minerals can be recovered."
