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





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New Sulphur Cap Coming in 2020

- MARPOL Annex VI Air Emissions
- Current sulphur content limit general 3.5% m/m (average is 2.7%)
- New sulphur limit after 1 Jan 2020 0.5% m/m
- Sulphur limit for Emission Control Areas -0.1%
 - Baltic ECA
 - North Sea ECA
 - North American ECA
 - Caribbean ECA
- Rejected: "Experience Building Phase"

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
