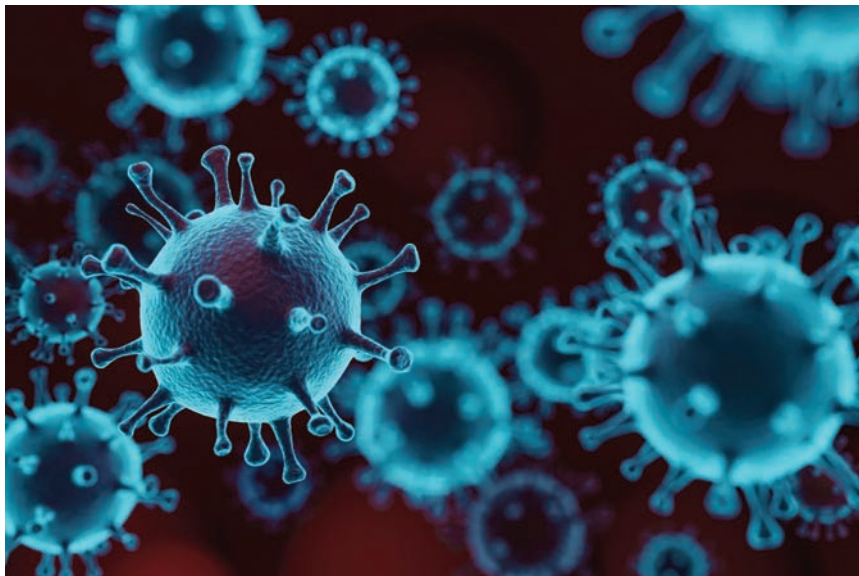

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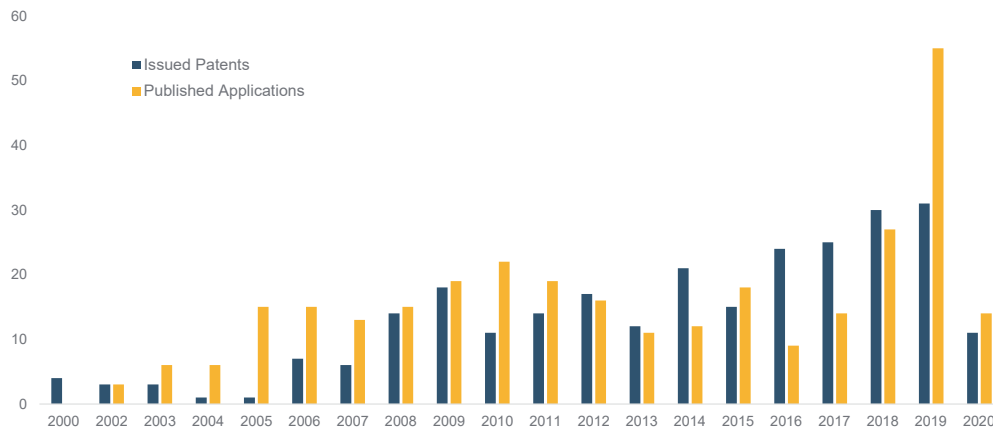

Early SARS Patent

- US Patent No.: 7,048,953, issued May 23, 2006.
 - 4. A method to reduce risks of infection of the **human respiratory system** by **respiratory pathogens in an enclosed public area** having one or more human beings within said enclosed area comprising the following steps: (a) within a period of time of 30 minutes before entering said public area, inhaling concentrated vapors from an essential oil mixture comprising 50% *Eucalyptus globulus* and 50% *Melaleuca alternifolia*,

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
