## Serve the Foreign Defendant – Due Process

- "The fundamental requisite of due process of law is the opportunity to be heard."
  - Mullane v. Central Hanover Bank & Trust Co., 339 US 306, 314 (1950)
- "An elementary and fundamental requirement of due process in any
  proceeding which is to be accorded finality is notice <u>reasonably calculated</u>,
  <u>under all the circumstances</u>, to apprise interested parties of the pendency
  of the action and afford them an opportunity to present their objections."
  - Mullane v. Central Hanover Bank & Trust Co., 339 US 306, 314 (1950)
  - Volkswagenwerk Aktiengesellschaft v. Schlunk, 486 US 694, 707 (1988)

## Serve the Foreign Defendant – Due Process

- o "The notice must be of such nature as reasonably to convey the required information, and it must afford a reasonable time for those interested to make their appearance."
  - o Mullane v. Central Hanover Bank & Trust Co., 339 US 306, 314 (1950)
- "But if with due regard for the practicalities and peculiarities of the case these conditions are reasonably met, the constitutional requirements are satisfied."
  - o Mullane v. Central Hanover Bank & Trust Co., 339 US 306, 314 (1950)
- PRO TIP: There is no magic formula.

## Serve the Foreign Defendant – Due Process

- HOWEVER: do not offend "traditional notions of fair play and substantial justice."
- "But when notice is a person's due, process which is a mere gesture is not due process."
- o "The means employed must be such as one desirous of actually informing the absentee might reasonably adopt to accomplish it."
- "The reasonableness and hence the constitutional validity of any chosen method may be defended on the ground that it is in itself reasonably certain to inform those affected."
  - Mullane v. Central Hanover Bank & Trust Co., 339 US 306, 314 (1950)
- Question: How do I avoid offending the traditional notions?
