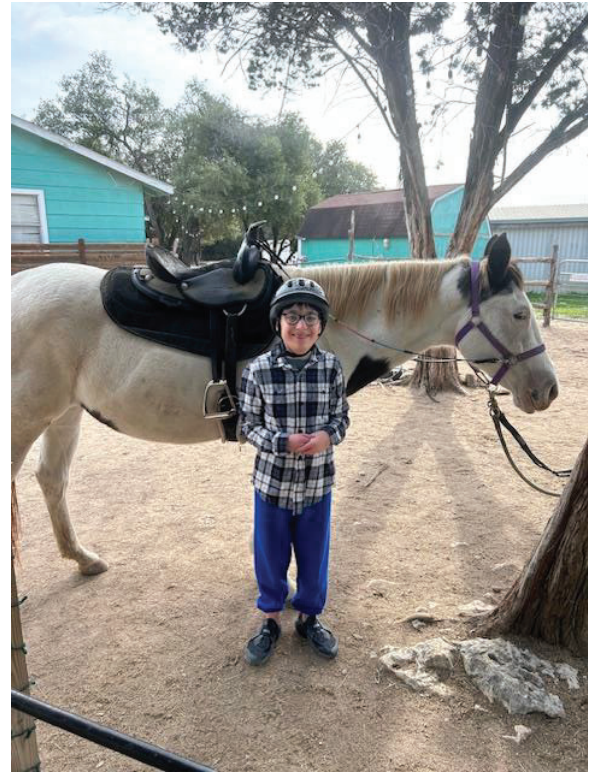

Prepping for Annual Renewal:

- Goal: no reduction in benefits
- Ask for prior year assessment (STAR Kids Screening and Assessment Instrument)
- Fill out before assessment with current status
- Review questions with any another caregiver(s):
 - Other caregivers may see things differently
 - Brainstorming/mitigate disagreements

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“Snapshots in Time”

- Coordinate doctor appt. 7 days before assessment date
- New doctor orders, weight and height
- Have therapy dates locked in w/in the last 7 days for OT, PT, and ST
- Coordinate as many therapy hours as allowed b/c part of assessment includes therapy hours

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Document, Document, Document!

- Keep a calendar:
 - ER
 - Hospital visits
 - Doctor visits
 - Medicine/food changes
- Nurses' notes from private agencies
- Pediatrician one pager

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
